Solid Single Convex



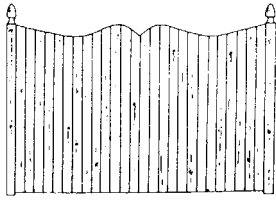

Solid Double Convex



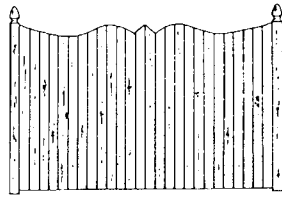
